Motion No. 1 having been called, debate resumed on the amendment of the Minister for Mental Health as follows —

To delete all words after "House" and insert —

commends the Barnett Government for its election commitment to spend \$13 million to develop a comprehensive Western Australian State Suicide Prevention Strategy with a particular emphasis on young people, young men, Aboriginal people and people who live in rural and regional Western Australia, and notes the comprehensive analysis being undertaken by Edith Cowan University into the rate of suicide and all other aspects of suicide in Western Australia.

That this House condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to honour its election commitment to spend \$13 million in the first two years of government to develop a comprehensive WA State Suicide Prevention Strategy with a particular emphasis on young people, young men, Aboriginal people and people who live in rural and regional Western Australia, and calls on the Government to support a coronial investigation into the rate of suicide.
