1. State Suicide Prevention Strategy (*Notice given 17 May 2011*)

Continuation of remarks Hon Linda Savage – 37 mins (Wednesday, 19 September 2012) on the amendment of Minister for Mental Health as follows —

commends the Barnett Government for its election commitment to spend \$13 million to develop a comprehensive WA State Suicide Prevention Strategy with a particular emphasis on young people, young men, Aboriginal people and people who live in rural and regional Western Australia, and notes the comprehensive analysis being undertaken by Edith Cowan University into the rate of suicide and all other aspects of suicide in WA.

to the motion of Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich as follows -

That this House condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to honour its election commitment to spend \$13 million in the first two years of government to develop a comprehensive WA State Suicide Prevention Strategy with a particular emphasis on young people, young men, Aboriginal people and people who live in rural and regional Western Australia, and calls on the Government to support a coronial investigation into the rate of suicide.

8. **Resources Boom - Access to Future Economic Benefits** (Notice given 19 October 2011)

Hon Jon Ford: To move -

That this House condemns the Barnett Government for its lack of vision, investment and action in ensuring that Western Australia uses the resource boom to build its capacity to provide economic certainty for all citizens well beyond the boom years.

9. Uranium Mining Ban (Notice given 22 November 2011)

Hon Jon Ford: To move -

That this House condemns the Barnett Government's lifting of Western Australia's long standing ban on uranium mining, and asks the Government how it can ensure that Western Australians -

- (a) will not be encumbered with long term financial commitments to manage radioactive and heavy metal contaminated sites for over a thousand years of future generations;
- (b) interests can be protected with public sector advice that current approvals can be granted by accepting industry assertions that the environment will not be contaminated by mining waste over the next thousand years or more; and
- (c) that Occupational Safety and Health regulators and laws are now, and will in the future be, competent and adequate to ensure workers and their families are not endangered by this uranium industry?

10. Social Work Profession - Inclusion in National Registration and Accreditation Scheme (*Notice given 22 November 2011*)

 - (c) to identify what circumstances and conditions enabled these abuses to occur and to identify where these circumstances and conditions still exist and how they can be addressed; and
 - (d) to identify any perpetrators who may still be working with children and as such may still pose a risk to children.
