We note that the savage 46 percent increase in electricity and 30 percent increase in water charges over two years has resulted in an increase in the dividends the State Government is receiving from the power and water utilities.

We say 'enough is enough' and call on the Barnett/Grylls Government to keep future increases to below the rate of inflation.

- (d) why she has been asleep at the wheel whilst tourism operators in Western Australia go under.
