The Hon Paul Llewellyn moved -Page 27, after line 2 — To insert — " (2) At the end of section 27 the following subsection is inserted — " Without limiting the generality of paragraph (g) of subsection (1) the (3) fees referred to in that paragraph may be set by reference to the volume of water allocated under a license.

#### Debate ensued.

The Deputy Chairman left the Chair at 8.59pm The Deputy Chairman resumed the Chair at 9.31pm ". ".

#### Deputy Chairman's Ruling

The Deputy Chairman ruled as follows -

Members, prior to me leaving the chair, the Leader of the House asked me to consider whether the amendment moved by Hon Paul Llewellyn was within the scope and purpose of the Bill as provided for under standing order 237(a); that is, whether the amendment was within the powers, and whether the implication of volumetry charge would be considered an excise.

With respect to the first point raised by the Leader of the House, obviously many of these amendments can variably be viewed in both lights. However, the practice and procedures of this place has been to seek to ensure and not limit the House in exercising its rights and privileges. I draw the attention of Members to the ruling that was made on 26 October 2006 and I will briefly quote one line as follows -

Members will know that this place has always applied standing order 237(a) in a very wide manner so as not to restrict this House's rights and privileges.

Obviously that ruling included a lot more detail on these matters.

Further, in considering the question raised by the Leader of the House, I accept that the primary purpose of the Bill relates to the administrative framework relating to water resource legislation within Western Australia, but it does deal with the consequential implications of the manner in which the powers under the various Water Acts in this State can be exercised.

The Member's amendment does not seek to introduce a new power, but simply highlights an option that may be considered under section 27(g) of the *Rights in Water and Irrigation Act* 1914, but it is certainly not a mandatory provision. It provides an option for how the existing powers of the Bill can be administered under the administrative framework. In light of that, I believe that on that point the Member's amendment is within the scope of this Bill. As I mentioned earlier, the Member's amendment does not seek to introduce a new power, but simply provides an option under an existing power within the substantive Act.

Finally, the question of whether it is an excise can be determined only by the commission. If the commission chooses to exercise that power, it can only look at the question of an excise when it seeks to implement and set the fee. That is the appropriate time to consider whether it is an excise. It is my intention to accept the Member's amendment.

The Leader of the House moved -

That further consideration of Clause 76 be postponed until after Clause 233.

Question - put and passed.

Clauses 77 to 88 agreed to.

Clause 89.

The Leader of the House moved -

Page 30, line 10 — To delete "officer" and insert instead —

" authority ".

Amendment - put and passed.

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Clauses 90 to 102 agreed to.

Clauses 103 to 109.

Debate ensued.

The Leader of the House moved -

That further consideration of Clauses 103 to 109 be postponed until after Clause 233.

Question - put and passed.

Clauses 110 and 111 agreed to.

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Clause 112. Debate ensued. Interruption of Debate [SO 61(c)].

The Acting President resumed the Chair.

The Deputy Chairman of Committees reported that the Committee had considered the Bill, made progress, and asked leave to sit again.

Ordered - That the Committee have leave to sit again.
