- C13) In regard to Heavy Vehicle User Charge project expenditure:
- a. How much of the \$67 million allocation will be for planning work?

#### Answer:

The detailed cost estimates for a Heavy Vehicle Charging scheme are to be developed. The Project Definition Plan will include a breakdown of costs, including costs for planning and physical infrastructure.

b. How much of the \$67 million allocation is for implementing physical infrastructure?

c. What has the \$5 million recorded as estimated expenditure in 2015-16 towards the Heavy Vehicle User Charge project been spent on?

The Committee notes no information has been provided on how the \$67 million has been arrived at. Please detail what, if any, allocation was made for planning work when the estimated \$67 million expenditure was developed.

6. Is grade separation the only long term solution for congestion around Scarborough Beach and in particular the West Coast Highway and Scarborough Beach Road intersection?

Answer:

Not necessarily.

The Committee requests further information on the position of Main Roads on why grade separation is not the only long term solution for this congestion — what other long term solution(s) does Main Roads have in mind?

### Answer:

Main Roads has undertaken some preliminary planning work for a grade separation at the West Coast Highway - Scarborough Beach Road intersection and has also developed a concept to provide additional traffic capacity through the intersection.
