Question: Hon Ken Travers MLC asked if the Public Transport Authority is an organisation qualified to undertake maintenance work in accordance with the AQF framework?

Answer:

The AQF does not pre-qualify or determine if any business should or should not carry out maintenance work. Where a specific license or qualification is required, such as electricians or engineers, then only individuals who hold such qualifications are allowed to perform that work. The AQF sets industry generic skills only. Each rail operator adds additional detail to reflect its operational requirements and particular infrastructure needs.

Question: Hon Ken Travers MLC asked whether the recent incidents including the two previous incidents on the rail system dated 5 January 2010 and on 17 August 2011 were classified as a Category A or B incident under the Rail Safety Act?

Answer:

The incident on 5 January 2010 was classified as a Category B incident in accordance with Rail Safety Regulations 1999 Schedule 1.

The incident on 17 August 2011 was classified as a Category B incident in accordance with Rail Safety Regulations 2011 s32(1).

The incident on 3 October 2012 was classified as a Category A incident in accordance with Rail Safety Regulations 2011 s32(1).

The incident on 4 October 2012 was classified as a Category B incident in accordance with Rail Safety Regulations 2011 s32(1).

Question: Hon Ken Travers MLC asked the Public Transport Authority to provide an update with respect to the current status of safety delegates for railcar drivers.

Answer:

The Public Transport Authority has two OSH representatives elected by railcar drivers. As instructed by Commissioner Mayman these two OSH representatives will stay on despite the fact that their term has expired until such time as they are reelected or others have been elected in their place.

As per the agreement between the then Delegates and PTA representatives, the Western Australian Electoral Commission has called for nominations for Driver OSH representatives. The nominations for Driver OSH representatives have now closed and ten driver safety representatives will be elected by railcar drivers by 16 November 2012.

Question: Hon Ken Travers MLC asked the Public Transport Authority to provide the full investigation reports undertaken into the two incidents on the rail system dated 5 January 2010 and on 17 August 2011 and whether these are the only two incidents in the last five years (apart from the most recent incident on 3 October 2012) which have involved overhead wires or pantographs. If there are others, please provide the details of each case.

Answer:

The Public Transport Authority has developed Investigation Reports for the incidents on 5 January 2010 and 17 August 2011 at the request of the Office of Rail Safety. The nature of these reports are highly technical and are developed in a transparent and frank manner for members of the Office of Rail Safety who are educated in the technical aspects of the rail environment. Accordingly, without the knowledge of the industry and of the highly technical aspects of these reports, they can be misinterpreted and therefore inappropriate to provided.

Question: Hon Lynn MacLaren MLC asked with respect to the investment of additional bus service kilometres, what improvements have been made across the bus network in addition to identifying which of those are bus feeder services to train stations. Please also advise what additional subsidy the Public Transport Authority pays for each of the new or enhanced bus services.

Answer:

A total of 95 improvements were made to the Transperth bus network during the 2011/2012 financial year, of which 10 were new routes and 85 were improvements to existing services.

It is not possible to identify the additional cost for each new or enhanced bus services.

Question: Hon Ken Travers MLC asked with respect to the Disability Discrimination Act requirements what are the obligations in terms of ramps for bus stops, where does the State rate in accordance with the target and how close to that target is the State.

Answer:

The Disability Standards for Accessible Public Transport 2002 broadly outlines accessibility requirements.

Compliance achieved as at 31 December 2007 was estimated at less than 1 per cent. Compliance achieved as at 31 December 2012 will be provided at that time.

Since 2010/2011 the State Government has allocated funds to upgrade 600 bus stops per annum. The PTA has exceeded this target each year and to date has upgraded approximately 1 700 bus stops.
