Dear Ms. Reilly,

I attended the hearing on Monday 4th April 2011 with Mrs. Carol Reeve-Fowkes. Upon reading my input into the Transcript, I noticed page 5 last paragraph, the name Laszic has been spelt Latsick. I have made a couple of other minor changes on the uncorrected copy of the transcript highlighted with a red biro. Page 11 Kwinana industrial council should read Community Industrial Forum (C.I.F) I hope this can be changed.

Your letter refers to any 'Incorrect factual information' needing a corrected view in a covering letter to be sent back with the signed off transcript. Would you please refer to page 7 half way down – In fact he lost his job. Please delete this as I can't prove it was only because of his comment about the cost of scrubbers.

I have in fact made a blunder in the last paragraph on page 11 and hope you will be able to change it.

Ms. Hill: I think what you have got there is factual, because I talk in some of the letters about them wanting to burn tyres. This should read FLY ASH- this was as recently as 2007 – they said it is encapsulated in the product.

Could you please add in there as the next sentence:-

"Cockburn Cement Limited also wanted to burn old rubber tyres as an alternative fuel source". "I have given you a copy of the WA Waste Management Board notes which state that rubber tyres would be suitable to incinerate in approved cement kilns".

I apologise for my error on the day of mixing up rubber tyres with Fly Ash. By adding the new paragraph about CCL wanting to burn tyres it shows that both Fly Ash and rubber Tyres were something Adelaide Brighton (the owners of Cockburn Cement) wanted to burn as an alternative fuel.

I do hope the above information can be corrected as I was very nervous on the day and I would appreciate these changes being made on the 'corrected copy'.

May I also ask for a copy of the finalised transcript.
