The Committee asked:

1) Agency Expenditure Review program

Answer: Savings have not been identified in the department's budget; the department is underfunded. Appropriate accountability and value for money is exercised when funds are expended and efficiencies are always sought.

2) National partnership agreements

Answer: The department does not have any national partnership agreements.

3) Commonwealth grants

Answer: The department does not have any Commonwealth grants.

4) 10 year Strategic Asset Investment Plans

Answer: The department's plan is referred to as the SAMP or Strategic Asset Management Plan and deals with the \$1M capital funding received each year. Our plan is reviewed regularly and is included as "Attachment A".
