Hon Colin de Grussa asked to be provided with information about the proportion of students in both public and non-government schools receiving the boarding away from home allowance who are attending regional residential colleges versus schools in Perth.

Answer: In 2016, of the students who received the Boarding Away from Home Allowance, 47% (736.25 students) boarded in regional Western Australia, with 567.25 students attending public schools and 169 attending non-government schools. Conversely, 53% of students (819.75 students) boarded in the metropolitan area, with 81 students attending public schools and 738.75 attending non-government schools.

Numbers may be fractional for one of two reasons: a student might have boarded for only part of the year; or a student may have moved between a public and a non-government school within a single year. For example, a student boarding for the full year at a residential college may have attended a public school for one term, and then moved to a non-government school with a boarding facility for three terms, so would have been applied as 0.25 for public and 0.75 for non-government.

Hon Martin Aldridge asked whether there was anything the state could do to try and resolve the issue of regional schools being unable to access funding as, because of religious requirements, they cannot attract a chaplain.

Answer: Under the current arrangements for both the Commonwealth and State-funded in-school chaplaincy programs, schools are limited to purchasing the services of a qualified school chaplain. The nature of the chaplaincy services to be provided, including the religious affiliation of the school chaplain, is decided by the school and its community.

Schools funded under the In School State Funded Chaplaincy Program (ISSFCP) are currently required to employ chaplains who meet the requirements stipulated by the Commonwealth, as the original intent of the ISSFCP was to expand the number of schools funded under the Commonwealth program. The State program was modelled on the Commonwealth program.

It is acknowledged that regional and remote schools may find it difficult to attract a chaplain; attracting suitably qualified secular personnel to provide a pastoral care service would also be a challenge in these locations.

There are ways to address demand for chaplaincy services in remote and regional locations built into the current agreement with YouthCARE. These include itinerant chaplains and fly-in-fly-out support chaplains.

Agreements for both the Commonwealth and State funded in-school chaplaincy programs expire at the end of 2018. The option for schools to choose a chaplain or a secular pastoral care service can be considered in planning for the State-funded component of this service for 2019 and beyond.
