Additional Community Attitude Monitor reports, prepared for the Department of the Premier and Cabinet by Synovate, following community attitudinal surveys undertaken in October 2007 and January 2008, have been identified by the Premier. These reports follow Community Attitude Monitor Reports of March 2007 and July 2007, which indicate that the vast majority of those surveyed on a variety of State Government services, policies, overall performance, and the outlook for Western Australia opined that the provision of State public services, such as mental health, health, education, and law and order are steadily eroding, -

- (1) Can the Premier please confirm that these studies were paid for with public monies?
- (2) Does the Premier deny that the October 2007 and January 2008 Community Attitude Monitor reports confirm that the vast majority of those surveyed, consider that mental health services in Western Australia are a serious problem?
- (3) Does the Premier deny that the October 2007 and January 2008 Community Attitude Monitor Reports confirm that the majority of those surveyed believe that mental healthy services have not improved, but have got worse or stayed the same?
- (4) Is it the intention of the Premier to withhold release of the Community Attitude Monitor reports of October 2007 and January 2008 until after the State election, due to the evidence contained in the reports relative to the unhappiness by those surveyed relative to the provision of many State public services?
- (5) How much more time does the Government need to keep these reports secret in order to understand community attitudes and concerns for future action?
