1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 11.00am pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Barry House, took the Chair and read prayers.

2. Water Catchments - South West Recovery Program

Motion No. 1 having been called, debate resumed on the motion of Hon Giz Watson as follows -

That in the light of the declining rainfall and catastrophic decline in surface water inflow to our dams, and the impact of salinity on our South West water catchments this House calls on the Government to implement as a matter of priority a comprehensive upper catchment recovery program based on farm forestry that aims to restore water and salt balance in the six key water catchments in the region.

- (b) includes a contract entered into
 - (i) in substitution for a contract referred to in paragraph (a) or any provision of such a contract; or

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(ii) by way of amendment of a contract referred to in paragraph (a) or subparagraph (i);

national provisions means the National Gas Access (Western Australia) Law, the Rules made under that Law, and the National Gas Access (Western Australia) Regulations;

relevant national provisions means any of the national provisions having the same purpose as a provision of the Gas Code, as defined in the National Gas Access (Western Australia) Law section 2.
