LandCorp recently developed and released additional residential blocks in Buckingham Way Collie. Owners of these blocks have had to spend considerable funds on landfill prior to construction, after it was found that the material used to fill the lots contained logs, rotting matter and gravel boulders and was found by the Collie Shire to be unsuitable for the construction of a residential dwelling.
