- (g) if there must be a tendering process for access, is it possible for WA Limestone to offer its holding at Lot 1 as part of its bid for the Landcorp resource;
- (h) if a suitable land-swap can be arranged, will the Minister undertake for Lot 1, (2350) Wanneroo Road, Nowergup to be incorporated into the Neerabup National Park which sits adjacent to the said parcel of land;

- (i) what other solutions besides a land-swap are being considered to resolve this issue; and
- (j) the Western Australian Planning Commission's land acquisition program for the 2009–2010 included purchases of land totalling some \$67,000,000. Will the Minister consider purchasing this property for the whole of the community and to protect the environmental values of the Neerabup National Park, Bush Forever Site 383 and the Lake Nowergup Sanctuary?
