### 4. Brief Ministerial Statements

Brief Ministerial Statements were made by –

The Minister for Veterans Issues on his attendance at the Land Forces International Land Defence Exposition in Brisbane, 1 - 2 June 2021.

The Minister for Sport and Recreation on funding support provided to small and medium associations via the Sport Development Fund grants program.

The Minister for Finance on the transfer of the royalty collection function from the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety to the Department of Finance from October 4, 2021.

The Minister for Disability Services on Government funding to support disability advocacy services.

### 5. Arts and Culture Trust Bill 2021

The Minister for Culture and the Arts, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for “An Act –

- to repeal the *Perth Theatre Trust Act 1979* and the *Perth Theatre Trust (Common Seal) Regulations 1980*; and
- to make consequential amendments to various Acts; and
- for related purposes .” be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Minister for Culture and the Arts presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Minister for Culture and the Arts moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr P.J. Rundle moved, That the debate be adjourned.

## **6. Animal Welfare and Trespass Legislation Amendment Bill 2021**

The Attorney General, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for “An Act –

- to amend the *Animal Welfare Act 2002* to make provision for designated inspectors; and
- to amend *The Criminal Code* and the *Restraining Orders Act 1997* to make provisions relating to trespass on a place where animal source food production is carried out.” be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Attorney General presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Attorney General moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr P.J. Rundle moved, That the debate be adjourned.

## **7. Courts Legislation Amendment (Magistrates) Bill 2021**

The Attorney General, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for “An Act to amend the *Children’s Court of Western Australia Act 1988* and the *Magistrates Court Act 2004*.” be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Attorney General presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Attorney General moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr P.J. Rundle moved, That the debate be adjourned.

## **8. Legal Profession Uniform Law Application Bill 2021**

The Attorney General, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for “An Act to –

- apply the Legal Profession Uniform Law (with modifications) as a law of Western Australia; and
- provide for the tabling and disallowance of amendments made to the Legal Profession Uniform Law; and
- provide for local matters that are ancillary to, or affect the operation of, the Legal Profession Uniform Law as a law of Western Australia; and
- otherwise provide for the regulation of legal practise in Western Australia; and

- repeal the *Legal Profession Act 2008* and the *Law Society Public Purposes Trust Act 1985*; and
- make savings and transitional arrangements; and
- make consequential amendments to various Acts, and for related purposes.” be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Attorney General presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Attorney General moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr P.J. Rundle moved, That the debate be adjourned.

Question put and passed.

### **9. Legal Profession Uniform Law Application (Levy) Bill 2021**

The Attorney General, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for “An Act to amend the *Legal Profession Uniform Law Application Act 2021*.” be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Attorney General presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Attorney General moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr P.J. Rundle moved, That the debate be adjourned.

Question put and passed.

### **10. Railway (BBI Rail Aus Pty Ltd) Agreement Amendment Bill 2021**

The Order of the Day for the resumption of the debate upon the second reading of the bill was read.

That this House condemns the WA Labor Government for its failure to deliver a gold standard of transparency and accountability, and breaching the trust of West Australians since the State Election in relation to matters including COVID-19 management, electoral reform, the health crisis, and the appointment of the CCC Commissioner.

Debate ensued.
