5. Standing Order 230(b) - Referral to Standing Committee on Procedure and Privileges

Hon Norman Moore, by leave, moved, without notice -

That the Standing Committee on Procedure and Privileges consider and report to the House whether, in light of the Acting President's ruling on the application and effect of SO 230(b) given on Wednesday, October 23 2002, it is desirable to amend the rule so as to ensure that debate on a Bill stands adjourned for a specified period immediately following the speech given by the Minister or Member in charge of the Bill when moving for the second reading.

6. Select Committee into the Fremantle Eastern Bypass - Establishment

Motion No. 5 having been called.

Debate resumed on the amendment of Hon Norman Moore as follows -

That the words "That a Select Committee of five Members is appointed, any three of whom constitute a quorum" be deleted and the following words be substituted -

- " That the Standing Committee on Public Administration and Finance be required ", to the motion of Hon Simon O'Brien as follows -
 - That a Select Committee of five Members is appointed, any three of whom constitute a quorum, to inquire and report on the history of that part of the Metropolitan Region Scheme known as the Fremantle Eastern Bypass and related road infrastructure including -
 - (a) initial inclusion of the bypass in the Metropolitan Region Scheme;
 - (b) subsequent modifications to the Metropolitan Region Scheme in respect of the bypass;
 - (c) the decision making process and advice given to Government by relevant Government agencies including agencies responsible for Main Roads, Planning, Transport and Environment;
 - (d) directions given by Government to agencies with responsibility for decision making; and
 - (e) other matters pertaining to the history and possible future of the Fremantle Eastern Bypass that the Committee may consider useful to bring to the attention of the House.

- (2) The Committee have power to send for persons, papers and records and to travel from place to place.
- (3) Standing Orders 322, 323, 330 and 331 apply to the proceedings of the Committee and any contrary or inconsistent provision of Chapter XXIII is modified accordingly.
- The Committee may present interim reports without a requirement for leave is to (4) report finally not later than November 30 2002.

Point of Order

Hon Barry House raised the following Point of Order -

When the Minister was reading the second reading speech, I think he deliberately missed out the word "almost" in a previous paragraph. I saw him take a pen to the second reading speech from which he is quoting. I seek some clarification on that because it may be important at some stage as to whether the word "almost" is supposed to be in the second reading speech.

Deputy President's Ruling

The Deputy President ruled as follows -

What the Minister actually says in his second reading speech to the House, as recorded by Hansard, is to be taken as the second reading speech. The second reading speech notes are distributed to Members as a courtesy to enable Members to follow, in general terms, what is being said. Usually, the notes are word for word of what is being said. However, the bottom line is that what the Minister says during his second reading speech is what is to be taken to be the second reading speech as it will be recorded in Hansard in due course. That is one of the reasons why second reading speeches are generally not interrupted. It is important to get down the exact words that are spoken and not just rely on the typewritten notes that are provided for guidance.
