The Assembly met at 2.00 p.m. pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

2. Brief Ministerial Statements

Sanderling Drive, Roebuck Estate – Mrs C.A. Martin presented a petition from 244 persons requesting a halt to all works intended to permanently facilitate the closure of the right hand access at Sanderling Drive and then a reassessment of the situation with a view to creating an industrial traffic turnoff at the Tanami Drive section and the reinstatement of right hand access at Sanderling Drive (P. 421).

Proposed Hammond Park High School – Mr F.M. Logan presented a petition from 134 persons requesting that the Minister for Education immediately bring forward the development and construction of a High School at Hammond Park (P. 422).

Bus Service 467 along Duffy Terrace – Ms A.R. Mitchell presented a petition from 107 persons requesting that the proposed changes to Bus Route 467 do not proceed to exclude Duffy Terrace from the current route (P. 423).

Bus Service between Pinjarra and Mandurah Train Stations – Mr M.J. Cowper presented a petition from 224 persons requesting that a regular bus service between Pinjarra and Mandurah be provided (P. 424).

Uranium Mining in Western Australia – Ms A.S. Carles presented a petition from 220 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly immediately reinstate the ban on uranium mining in Western Australia (P. 425).

Increases in Fees and Charges – Mr C.J. Tallentire presented a petition from 64 persons requesting that relief from increased household fees and charges be given to Western Australian householders (P. 426).

Mining in Whicher Scarp – Ms A.S. Carles presented a petition from 91 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly endorse the Environmental Protection Authority's recommendation with regard to mining in Whicher Scarp (P. 427).

10. Matter of Public Interest – Number of Child Deaths

The Speaker informed the Assembly that he was in receipt of a notice from Mr E.S. Ripper that he intended to move a motion on a matter of public interest.

At least five members having risen in support,

Mr E.S. Ripper moved,

That the House –

- (1) expresses its grave concern at the numbers of children dying in Western Australia and in particular those that were known to the Department of Child Protection; and
- (2) refers this extremely important issue to the Community Development and Justice Standing Committee for urgent investigation and report to the House by 1 November 2011.

Debate ensued.
