Questions listed for this sitting: -

6426. Mr V.A. Catania to the Treasurer; Minister for Finance; Aboriginal Affairs; Lands:

I refer to the contract awarded for the demolition of the Carnarvon Justice Complex at 81 Olivia Terrace, Carnarvon, to a Perth based business, Merit Consulting Group, for an estimated contract price of \$89,386 (including GST), and I ask:

- (a) Can the Minister confirm Merit Consulting Group has included all required work within the quote, including utility disconnections, asbestos survey, local tip disposal charges and dust suppression measures for the end of the project;
- (b) If these costs have not been incorporated as required to undertake this demolition, why not;
- (c) Who will be held responsible and be required to pay if there are any shortfalls in costs associated with the demolition;
- (d) Will all remediation works, including dust suppression, be completed to health and environmental specifications and in consultation with the Shire of Carnarvon; and
- (e) Who will be accountable for the cost and the ongoing maintenance of the site, until such time as the land is purchased?

6427. Mr D.T. Redman to the Minister for Planning:

I refer to the government's response to the Economics and Industry Standing Committee report into short-stay accommodation, and I ask:

- (a) Can the Minister update progress against all recommendations of the report:
 - (i) In doing so, give a timeline for implementation of the recommendations;
- (b) Have any matters arisen where government is likely to depart from the original response to the recommendations of the committee;
- (c) What is the likely implementation date where those seeking to register a short-stay accommodation place can do so using a central registration process; and
- (d) What is the Minister's advice for those local governments seeking to update their own policies on short-stay accommodation, given the government hasn't completed its processes in response to the report findings and recommendations?

6428. Mr P.A. Katsambanis to the Minister for Police; Road Safety:

I refer to the Licence Enforcement Division (LED), and ask:

- (a) In each of the last three years how many installers of closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras have been fined for operating without a licence;
- (b) In each of the last three years how many installers of CCTV cameras have been prosecuted for operating without a licence;
- (c) Does LED have measures in place to actively target unlicensed people working in the industry;
- (d) As part of state government tenders for the installation of CCTV cameras, what licence checks are conducted on those tendering for work; and
- (e) When was the most recent review of training conducted to ensure compliance with national industry standards?

6429. Mr K.M. O'Donnell to the Minister for Water; Forestry; Innovation and ICT; Science; Youth:

I refer to your press announcement of 21 September 2020, (More support to the Goldfields to help residents save money on their water bills), where you stated that the State Government paid Water Corporation \$46 million to subsidise the provision of water services to Kalgoorlie-Boulder, and I ask:

- (a) How was the amount of the subsidy determined;
- (b) What is the breakdown for the cost of services that are provided (e.g. Water, Sewerage, Connection fees etc.); and
- (c) Where is the money for the subsidy derived from? Is the subsidy provided from general State revenue or is the money derived from the profit Water Corporation makes from Metropolitan water service users?
