4. Quarterly Financial Results Report

9. President's Ruling — Quoting from an Electronic Device

The President ruled as follows —

President's Ruling

The President ruled as follows —

Today during Motions on Notice Hon Pierre Yang raised a point of order during the contribution of Hon James Hayward, pursuant to Standing Order 59(1), to request the Member to identify the documents that he was quoting from. Hon James Hayward identified a number of documents that he was quoting from including newspaper articles and his personal notes contained on an electronic device.

At the conclusion of Hon James Hayward's speech, the Parliamentary Secretary to the Attorney General rose to request that the Member table the documents, pursuant to Standing Order 59(2). The Acting President asked Hon James Hayward whether the documents were confidential and he replied that they were not.

As one of the documents quoted from was on an electronic device, the Acting President deferred the question as to whether this document can be required to be tabled pursuant to Standing Order 59.

It has become common practice in the Council for Members to refer to electronic devices as an aide de memoir — noting the prohibition on the reading of speeches in Standing Order 36. There is a strict prohibition on the use of electronic devices to take photographs, videos, make or receive calls and for devices to otherwise disrupt proceedings.

This issue has not previously arisen in the Council. The Legislative Assembly has adopted a practice whereby, in similar circumstances, a Member can be required to table a printed version of the electronic document.

My ruling is that a request to table a document pursuant to Standing Order 59 does extend to an electronic document on a personal device that is quoted from. In such circumstances, a Member will be required to table a printed copy of the electronic document.

I invite Hon James Hayward to rise and table the documents in question.

Hon James Hayward tabled speaking notes and referenced articles relating to public housing wait lists and ambulance ramping in Western Australia. (Tabled Paper 503).
