FIRST SESSION OF THE THIRTY-EIGHTH PARLIAMENT

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THURSDAY, 21 JUNE 2012

### 1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

### 2. Petitions

Traffic Noise Burns Beach Road – Mr A.P. O'Gorman presented a petition from 63 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly extends the Mitchell Freeway north, connecting it to Neerabup Road, which will take much of the heavy traffic off Burns Beach Road, and ensures adequate noise reduction treatments are placed along the southern side of Burns Beach Road (P. 615).

Carpark Facilities Cockburn Central Railway Station – Mr F.M. Logan presented a petition from 203 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly calls upon the State Government to commit to building a new overpass road bridge joining an upgraded North Lake Road to Armadale Road and a new rail station with car parking at Russell Road (P. 616).

Collie Police and Citizens Youth Centre (PCYC) – Mr F.M. Logan, on behalf of Mr M.P. Murray presented a petition from 45 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly ensures the continued future of the Collie PCYC and that sufficient resources and funding are allocated to enable this to occur (P. 617).

Electronic Speed Zone Signs – Mr E.S. Ripper presented a petition from 72 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly ensures the installation of flashing electronic speed signs adjacent to the Redcliffe Primary School (P. 618).

Container Deposit Scheme – Mr E.S. Ripper presented a petition from 18 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly takes full and comprehensive action to ensure the passing of the Container Deposit Recovery Scheme Bill 2011 (P. 619).

Electronic Speed Zone Signs – Mr E.S. Ripper presented a petition from 265 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly ensures the installation of flashing electronic speed signs adjacent to the Notre Dame Catholic Primary School (P. 620).

Belmont Ski Area – Mr E.S. Ripper presented a petition from 22 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly ensures that the Barnett Government completely relocates the Belmont Ski Area (P. 621).

Electronic Speed Zone Signs – Mr E.S. Ripper presented a petition from 57 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly ensure the installation of flashing electronic speed signs adjacent to the Australian Islamic College (P. 622).
