1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 am pursuant to adjournment.

2. Petition

Protection of Bushland at 179 Erindale Road Hamersley – Mrs J.M.C. Stojkovski presented a petition from 1,381 people asking the Legislative Assembly to protect the bushland at Lots 802 and 803, 179 Erindale Rd Hamersley because of its importance to the environment and biodiversity (P. 23).
