That a Select Committee of three Members be appointed to enquire into and report on -

- (1) The funding, management and provision of primary health services by the following Aboriginal Health Services in Western Australia -
 - Bega Garnbirringu Health Service;
 - Carnarvon Aboriginal Medical Service;
 - Derbarl Yerrigan Health Service;
 - East Kimberley Aboriginal Medical Service;
 - Geraldton Regional Aboriginal Medical Service;
 - Kimberley Aboriginal Medical Service Council;
 - Mawarnkarra Health Service;
 - Ngaanyatjarra Health Service;
 - Ngangganawili Aboriginal Health Service;

- Nindilingarri Aboriginal Health Service;
 - Puntunkurnu Aboriginal Medical Service;
 - South West Aboriginal Medical Service; and
 - Wirraka Maya Aboriginal Health Service.
- (2) In particular, the Committee is to enquire into and report upon -
- (a) the organisational and contractual relationships between the Aboriginal Health Services and the Department of Health;
 - (b) the adequacy of core funding provided from Commonwealth and State sources for primary health services currently being delivered and required to meet future community needs;
 - (c) the effectiveness of the primary health services currently being delivered;
 - (d) whether there is duplication, overlap or unmet need in the delivery of primary health services;
 - (e) future directions for the delivery of primary health services to Aboriginal communities; and
 - (f) any further matters relating to Aboriginal Health Services arising from the inquiry.
- (3) The Committee have power to send for persons, papers and records and to travel from place to place.
- (4) The Committee report to the House not later than September 26 2002 and if the House do then stand adjourned, the Committee to deliver its report to the President who shall cause the same to be printed by authority of this Order.

73. Limits on speaking times and certain debates

- 1 In the Council, a member may speak –

 - (b) on an amendment for not more than 15 minutes;
 - (c) to the question as amended for not more than 45 minutes if speaking for a first time;
 - (d) in reply for not more than 30 minutes;
 - (e) to the question for an adjournment of the House, excluding SO 72, for not more than 10 minutes,

and in relation to paragraph (a) the time specified may be extended, by leave, for not more than 15 minutes.
- 2 In a committee of the whole no member may speak for more than 10 minutes on each occasion.
- 3 Nothing in subclause 1(a)-(c) applies to –
 - (a) the Leader of the House;
 - (b) the Leader of the Opposition;

(c) the minister or member having charge of the business under consideration.

4 Nothing in this order affects a member's entitlement to speak.

5 Under SO 72 –

(a) the mover may speak for not more than 15 minutes;

(b) any other member may speak for not more than 10 minutes;

(c) any reply is not to exceed 5 minutes.

6 At the expiration of the time stated for each of the following debates, either the question is to be put and determined or, where SO 72 applies, the motion lapses :

40 mins

Special adjournment under SO 61(d)(ii)

20 mins

SO's suspension without notice – SO 433

60 mins

SO 72 adjournment

60 mins

Motion on notice (but not when an order of the day)

7 The Council, by ordinary resolution, may modify or exclude the application of this order in relation to a particular matter or for a specified period or both.

 - The physical and mental health of children, including the importance of sport and play in child development and litigious and industrial issues restricting these, the role of television, videos and computers, time spent in childcare, immunisation rates, services for disabled children;
 - Research relevant to children and its relevance to development public policy;
 - The impact of the justice system on children;
 - The transport system and its relevance to children's needs;
 - The staffing and budget for this Commission/Office; and
 - Any other matters that impact on the good growth and development of young children.
- (3) The Committee has power to send for persons, papers and records and to travel from place to place.
- (4) The Committee report to the house not later than June 30 2003 and if the House do then stand adjourned, the Committee to deliver its report to the President who shall cause the same to be printed by authority of this order.
