We note that the savage 57 percent increase in electricity and 46 percent increase in water charges over two years has resulted in an increase in the dividends the State Government is receiving from the power and water utilities.

We say enough is enough and call on the Barnett/Grylls Government to keep future increases to below the rate of inflation.
