- (c) any reply is not to exceed 5 minutes.
- At the expiration of the time stated for each of the following debates, either the question is to be put and determined or, where SO 72 applies, the motion lapses:

 - The staffing and budget for this Commission/Office; and
 - Any other matters that impact on the good growth and development of young children.
