The following synopsis of Bills dealt with by the Legislative Assembly this week, is intended only to give a brief outline of the purpose of each Bill at the second reading stage of the Bill and the stages it was dealt with in the Legislative Assembly.

#### Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Amendment Bill 2022

(Premier) (No. 79)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Act 2007*.

Second reading, debated and agreed.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council.

#### Health and Disability Services (Complaints) Amendment Bill 2022

(Minister for Health) (No. 60)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Health and Disability Services (Complaints Act)* 1995.

Consideration in detail of Legislative Council Message No. 71 Amendments 1, 2 and 3 agreed to.

#### **Teacher Registration Amendment Bill 2022**

(Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Education and Training) (No. 80)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Teacher Registration Act 2012*.

Second reading, debated and agreed.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council.

#### **Liquor Control Amendment (Protected Entertainment Precincts) Bill 2022**

(Minister for Racing and Gaming) (No. 90)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Liquor Control Act 1988* and to consequentially amend other Acts.

Bill introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered and debate adjourned.

#### **Directors' Liability Reform Bill 2022**

(Attorney General) (No. 89)

The purpose of this bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* and various other Acts in relation to the criminal liability of directors and other persons involved in the management of bodies corporate, and for related purposes.

Bill introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered and debate adjourned.

#### **Human Tissue and Transplant Amendment Bill 2022**

(Minister for Health) (No. 86)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Human Tissue and Transplant Act 1982*; and make consequential amendments to the *Anatomy Act 1930* and the *Health Legislation Administration Act 1984*.

Second reading, debated and agreed.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council.

## Road Traffic (Vehicles) Amendment (Offensive Advertising) Bill 2022

(Minister for Transport) (No. 82)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Road Traffic (Vehicles) Act 2012*. Second reading, debated and adjourned.
