#### **NON-GOVERNMENT BUSINESS**

#### 1. Research into the use of Cannabis

Hon Sophia Moermond: To move —

That this House notes the tabling in the Victorian Parliament of its *Legal and Social Issues Committee report into the use of cannabis in Victoria*, and urges the McGowan Government to consider undertaking similar research here in Western Australia.

#### 2. Cannabis Reform

Hon Dr Brian Walker: To move —

That this House agrees with the sentiments expressed on 15 April 2003 by Hon Mark McGowan, when he stated that —

- (a) those who choose to use cannabis infrequently ("once or twice or even 10 times") should not have a criminal record as a result of that choice;
- (b) that a personal choice to use cannabis recreationally should not have "an impact on young people's employment prospects or their capacity to travel"; and
- (c) that the *Cannabis Control Act 2003* was "a common sense Bill", aimed at addressing "a serious issue" which "requires serious measures by serious people".

And, so agreeing, the House calls upon the McGowan Government to express support for the Premier's stance and his long-held belief in common sense cannabis reform.
