I refer to this Government's decision to stop processing mineral title applications situated over pastoral land whilst awaiting the High Court decision in the State *vs* Ward case.

Can the Minister explain the basis for the decision since it does not reflect the current laws of the land and thus constitutes 'a pre-empting' of changes to the law, something the Auditor-General criticised in his most recent report, Report No. 1?
