Questions listed for this sitting: –

8047. Ms M.M. Quirk to the Premier

I refer to the Premier's answer to Question without Notice No. 53, asked by the Hon Ed Dermer and dated 8 March 2012. In his answer, the Premier anticipated that, by 30 April 2012, the Government would receive the report of the person conducting the independent review of post-incident analysis conducted by the Fire and Emergency Services Authority and the Department of Environment and Conservation, as recommended by the Keelty Report into the Margaret River bushfires. In relation to this, I ask:

- (a) has that report been received by the Government;
- (b) who conducted the review; and

- (c) when will the Premier be tabling the report?

8048. Mr M. McGowan to the Premier

In relation to the Government Secretariat Unit, details of which are included in the Premier's staffing list of 16 February 2012, can the Premier:

- (a) outline the role of this unit;
- (b) inform the house when staff members Frank Wright and Peter Beck were employed; and
- (c) outline the process followed in employing each of these staff members and their duties within the Government Secretariat Unit?

8049. Mr M. McGowan to the Premier

- (1) Could the Premier name all ministerial staff who have moved from a contracted position in a ministerial office to a permanent public sector, or public service, position during the period January 2008 to May 2012?
- (2) For each staff member at (1), could he indicate the position they currently hold and their salary?

8050. Mr J.N. Hyde to the Minister for Local Government

In relation to cautions issued by the Department of Local Government (DLG) to serving councillors since 2008, I ask:

- (a) how many councillors have been issued a caution by DLG in the last four years;
- (b) list the councils that have had councillors cautioned;
- (c) on what legal basis can the DLG issue a caution to a councillor (please cite the relevant Act sections and regulations, and any legal advice received); and
- (d) if the DLG cannot legally issue a caution then what steps has DLG taken to withdraw those cautions or advise those issued with a caution that the caution has no legal status?

8051. Mr P.C. Tinley to the Minister for Planning

I refer to the *Central Metropolitan Perth Sub-regional Strategy*, and the *Outer Metropolitan Perth and Peel Sub-regional Strategy*, and ask:

- (a) can the Minister confirm that public consultation on these plans closed in November 2010;
- (b) for what reason has a final version of these documents not yet been released;
- (c) when does the Minister expect these documents will be released; and
- (d) does the Minister consider the delay in finalising these documents to be acceptable, given the importance the Department places on implementing *Directions 2031*?

8052. Mr P.C. Tinley to the Minister for Planning

I refer to the Keelty Report and its recommendation that the State Government transfer responsibility for declaring bushfire prone areas from local government to the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC), and ask:

- (a) what action has the WAPC taken to respond to this and other recommendations in the report; and
- (b) what attempt has the Minister made to ensure fire risk areas are integrated into Town Planning Schemes to enable compliance with AS3959-2009 and, if none, why has the Minister failed to take action and when will he do so?

8053. Mr P.C. Tinley to the Minister for Planning

I refer to the provision of aged-care facilities in Wattle Grove, and ask:

- (a) does the Minister acknowledge that there is a shortage of aged-care in the Shire of Kalamunda and, if not, why not;
- (b) is the Minister aware of the significant public support in the area for the Shire's Scheme Amendment No. 18 to Local Planning Scheme 3;
- (c) for what reason has this amendment yet to be considered by the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC);
- (d) has the State Government engaged any independent planners to assess this amendment and, if so, who, and at what cost; and
- (e) is the Minister satisfied that members of the WAPC have properly managed any conflicts of interest on this matter (whether actual or perceived) and, if so, how?

- (c) has this amendment been adopted by the WAPC and, if not, when will it be dealt with?

- (1) Could the Minister advise of any plans to stop the increasing number of people who continue to text, read messages and participate in phone discussions on their mobiles while driving?
- (2) Is the State Government planning to research, implement or invest in any telecommunications-tracking technologies which assist police in detecting people who are using their mobile phones while driving and, if so, what are the capabilities of this technology and when might it be available?
- (3) Does the State Government have any plans to increase penalties for people using mobile phones while driving and, if so, what increased penalties are being considered?

8058. Ms M.M. Quirk to the Minister for Racing and Gaming

In relation to the conditions imposed on Northbridge and city late night venues, as announced by the Director of Liquor Licensing on 9 May 2011, I ask:

- (a) what mechanisms are being used to monitor the effectiveness of the conditions in reducing anti-social behaviour in the area;
- (b) what increase or decrease in anti-social behaviour have been recorded since the implementation of the conditions;
- (c) what statistical data is available in relation to any increase or decrease in anti-social behaviour;
- (d) how are the liquor licensing, policing and health authorities determining the efficacy of individual conditions;
- (e) what consultation is undertaken, or feedback received, by the above authorities to assess the impact on anti-social behaviour in the relevant areas;
- (f) has any work been undertaken to assess the commercial or tourism impact of the restrictions since they were imposed;
- (g) what research has been undertaken to assess the prevalence of illicit drugs and their impact on anti-social behaviour in the relevant areas;
- (h) what actions or initiatives are in place, or planned, to tackle the prevalence of illicit drugs and their impact on anti-social behaviour in the relevant areas;
- (i) what research has been undertaken to assess the prevalence of pre-loading and its impact on anti-social behaviour in the relevant areas; and
- (j) what actions or initiatives are in place, or planned, to tackle the prevalence of pre-loading and its impact on anti-social behaviour in the relevant areas?

8059. Ms R. Saffioti to the Minister for Education

At a cabinet meeting at Ballajura Community College on 12 March 2012, the Premier advised staff and students that a working party would be set up to look into a new auditorium at the College. In relation to this, I ask:

- (c) how many of the bookings listed at (a) were from people residing in postcodes other than the postcodes listed at (b), and what were those other postcodes; and
- (d) is there a departmental policy regarding which Driver Vehicle Service Centre can be used to book a driver's license test based on where that person resides?

8061. Mr R.H. Cook to the Minister for Health

I refer to the number of pay discrepancies experienced by doctors under the Health Corporate Network (HCN), and I ask:

- (a) how many complaints in total has the HCN received relating to errors in doctors' pay and allowances;
- (b) how many complaints relate to doctors being underpaid;
- (c) how many complaints relate to doctors being overpaid;
- (d) what is the average timeframe taken by the HCN to respond to discrepancies in doctors' pay;
- (e) given that I am aware of at least one doctor who has been underpaid \$35,000 in one calendar year which took several months to resolve, what is the largest amount that a doctor has been underpaid since 2008, in any calendar year;
- (f) what percentage of doctors' payslips are incorrect;
- (g) what system does the HCN use to pay doctors; and
- (h) will the HCN be replacing this pay system, given the large number of errors and, if so, when will it be replaced with a new system?

8062. Mr R.H. Cook to the Minister for Health

(1) I refer to the *Western Australian Women's Health Strategy 2012–2015*, and I ask:

- (a) has the strategy been formally released to the public; and
 - (i) if not, when will it become available;
 - (ii) if yes, will the Minister provide me with a copy of the strategy;

- (2) I note that the Draft Strategy indicated there would be annual action plans provided for each of the five priority areas, and I ask:
- (a) given it is already mid-way through 2012, will the Minister publicly release the annual action plans for each area for 2012;
 - (b) when will the action plans become available; and
 - (c) what resources have been allocated (if any) towards the implementation of the action plans?
