Hon Giz Watson to the Parliamentary Secretary representing the Minister for Water With regard to recent changes by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, lowering the maximum amount of uranium allowed in drinking water from 30 to 20 parts per billion and the subsequent requirement of municipalities to notify residents of the uranium levels over twice the 20-ppb limit, I ask -

- (1) What is the current West Australian drinking water standard relating to uranium content?
- (2) If there are no standards in respect of question (1), why not?
- (3) Are records kept of drinking water supplies containing uranium?
- (4) If no to question (3), why not?
- (5) If yes to (3), will the Minister table the latest set of data?
- (6) Are there any requirements for residents to be informed of high levels of uranium content in water?
- (7) If no to question (6), why not?
