Point of Order

Hon Norman Moore raised the following Point of Order -

My understanding is that Hon Paul Llewellyn is seeking to further amend the Act, as opposed to amending the Bill now before the committee. If he is seeking to do that, I seek your advice, Mr Deputy Chairman, on whether that is within the scope of the Bill. If we read the Member's proposed amendment, we see that it is not an amendment to the Bill, it is an amendment to the principal Act, which makes it an additional amendment.

Deputy Chairman's Ruling

The Deputy Chairman ruled as follows -

It appears that amendments must be within the scope and purpose of the Bill, and of course the whole Bill before us amends the principal Act. Whilst the proposed amendment moved by Hon Paul Llewellyn does not amend the Bill itself, provided it is within the scope and meaning of the Bill, it is acceptable.

Debate resumed.

Hon Paul Llewellyn moved -

Page 2, after line 14 — To insert —

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- (a) by deleting "the development of" and inserting instead
  - ' improved economic, social and environmental outcomes from ".
