## **TUESDAY, 18 AUGUST 2009**

#### 1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 3.30pm pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Barry House, took the Chair and read prayers.

### 2. Ministerial Statement - Black Smoke detected at the Esperance Port

The Minister for Transport made a Ministerial Statement with respect to black smoke detected at the Black Swan storage shed at the Esperance Port on 18 August 2009.

Ordered - That consideration of the Ministerial Statement be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

#### 3. Ministerial Statement - Australian Bravery Medal

The Minister for Environment made a Ministerial Statement with respect to an announcement by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia in relation to an Australian Bravery Medal to be awarded to Mr Paul Udinga, a national park ranger with the Department of Environment and Conservation, for saving the life of a visitor from the United Kingdom.

#### 4. Ministerial Statement - Small Business Advocate
