SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

The following synopsis of Bills dealt with by the Legislative Assembly this week, is intended only to give a brief outline of the purpose of each Bill at the second reading stage of the Bill and the stages it was dealt with in the Legislative Assembly.

Abortion Legislation Reform Bill 2023

(Minister for Health) (No. 120)

The purpose of this bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* to remove offences related to abortion; and to amend the *Public Health Act 2016* to regulate the performance of abortion by registered health practitioners and prohibit the performance of abortion by certain persons; and to make consequential and related amendments to other Acts; and for related purposes.

Second reading, debated and adjourned.

Duties Amendment (Off-the-Plan Concession and Foreign Persons Exemptions) Bill 2023

(Treasurer) (No. 122)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the Duties Act 2008.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered and adjourned.

Aboriginal Heritage Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2023

(Minister for Aboriginal Affairs) (No. 125)

The purpose of this bill is to repeal the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2021* and regulations made under that Act; and to amend the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972*; and to make consequential and related amendments to other written laws.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered and adjourned.

Perth Parking Management Bill 2023

(Minister for Transport) (No. 123)

The purpose of this bill is to provide for licensing and authorising of parking spaces in the parking management area in the metropolitan region to manage parking; and to provide that licence fees and other revenue under this Act may be used to improve transport, accessibility, economic activity or urban amenity for the benefit of the parking management area; and to repeal the *Perth Parking Management Act 1999*, the *Perth Parking Management (Taxing) Act 1999*; and to make a consequential amendment to the *Sentencing Act 1995*; and for related purposes.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered and adjourned.

Perth Parking Management Amendment Bill 2023

(Minister for Transport) (No. 124)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the Perth Parking Management Act 2023.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered and adjourned.

Nickel (Agnew) Agreement Amendment Bill 2023

(Minister for State and Industry Development, Jobs and Trade) (No. 96)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the Nickel (Agnew) Agreement Act 1974.

Second reading, debated and agreed.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and passed.

Women's and Babies' Hospital (09/08/23)

That this House condemns the WA Labor Government's decision to abandon the new Women's and Babies Hospital at OEII in Nedlands in favour of Fiona Stanley in Murdoch 20kms south of the city and not co-located with the Perth Children's Hospital, and calls on the Health Minister to listen to medical experts and family advocacy groups and rethink her Captain's call.
