THURSDAY, 17 MARCH 2022

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 am pursuant to adjournment.

2. Petition

Unreliable Power Supply in the Mid West – Mr R.S. Love presented a petition from 203 people asking the Legislative Assembly to request the Minister for Energy to take action to ensure the delivery of a reliable power supply to residents and businesses in the Shire of Irwin (P. 29).

3. Brief Ministerial Statements

The Minister for Prevention of Family and Domestic Violence on the 'Aboriginal Family Safety Strategy', a collaborative initiative to improve responses to family and domestic violence in Aboriginal communities.

The Minister for Small Business on a recent visit to small businesses in Bunbury.

The Minister for Environment on translocations, captive breeding and seed production to protect and conserve Western Australia's flora and fauna.

The Minister for Environment on a recent visit to Western Australia's south-west forests.
