Family Court Amendment Bill 2022

(Attorney General) (No. 66)

The purpose of this Bill is to to amend the *Family Court Act 1997* and to consequentially amend others Acts.

Second reading, debated and agreed.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council for concurrence.

Owner-Drivers (Contracts and Disputes) Amendment Bill 2022

(Minister for Transport) (No. 75)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Owner-Drivers (Contracts and Disputes) Act 2007*.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered, debate adjourned.

Casino Legislation Amendment (Burswood Casino) Bill 2022

(Minister for Racing and Gaming) (No. 76)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Bail Act 1982*.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered, debate adjourned.

Bush Fires Amendment Bill 2022

(Minister for Environment) (No. 73)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Bush Fires Act 1954*.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered, debate adjourned.

Health Services Amendment Bill 2021

(Minister for Health) (No. 34)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Health Services Act 2016*; and the *Mental Health Act 2014*; and the *Motor Vehicle (Catastrophic Injuries) Act 2016*; and the *Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre Act 1966*; and the *University Medical School, Teaching Hospitals, Act 1955*.
