1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 3.00pm pursuant to Temporary Orders.

The President, Hon Barry House, took the Chair and read prayers.

2. Petitions

Hon Kate Doust presented a petition from 4,945 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council to inquire into late term abortions performed in Western Australia with a view to changing the law to prohibit all abortions after 20 weeks gestation. (Tabled paper 3601).

Hon Ken Travers presented a petition from 299 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council to inquire into whether there are sufficient buses to service the northern suburbs and meet growing demand, particularly in Yanchep and Two Rocks. (Tabled paper 3602).

3. Ministerial Statement - 'Cannabis Messes with your Mind' - Campaign

The Minister for Mental Health made a Ministerial Statement with respect to a State Government campaign aimed at increasing awareness about the risks associated with cannabis use.

- s. 70A Trespass;
- s. 74A Disorderly behaviour in public;
- s. 172 Obstructing public officers;
- s. 153 Failure to comply with an officer's order under the Criminal Investigation Act 2006;
- s. 115(6) Remaining in an area adjacent to licensed premises after having been refused entry to, or required to leave, the premises;
- s. 115(7) Re-entering licensed premises within 24 hours of being refused entry to, or required to leave, the premises;
- s. 119(1) Consuming liquor in a place or premises without the consent of the occupier or person having control of the place or premises;
- s. 119(2) Bringing liquor into, or possessing or consuming liquor in, a sports ground or stadium;
- s. 119(4) Consuming liquor in a public place except under an exemption, licence or permit;
- s. 123(1) Juvenile purchasing, obtaining or consuming liquor on, or bringing liquor onto, licensed or regulated premises;
 - s. 123(2) Juvenile possessing liquor in a public place;
- s. 126(4) Re-entering licensed or regulated premises within 24 hours of being required to leave, or removed from, the premises under section 126;
- s. 126(5) Remaining in an area adjacent to licensed premises after having been required to leave, or being removed from, the premises;
- s. 5 Offences concerned with prohibited drugs and prohibited plants in relation to premises and utensils;
 - s. 6 Offences concerned with prohibited drugs generally;
 - s. 7 Offences concerned with prohibited plants generally;
 - s. 5 Seeking prostitute in or in view or within hearing of public place;
 - s. 6 Seeking client in or in view or within hearing of public place
 - s. 64B Contravention of a prohibition order; and
 - r. 40 Obstructing an authorised person

be and are hereby disallowed.

 - (i) preventing organisms, as defined in section 177B, that pose or are likely to pose a threat to fish or other aquatic resources or to their habitats from entering WA waters or an area of WA waters; or
 - (ii) preventing or controlling the spread of such organisms in WA waters or an area of WA waters; or
 - (iii) eradicating or removing such organisms from WA waters or an area of WA waters;

Debate ensued.
