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## NON-GOVERNMENT BUSINESS

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### 1. Safe Injecting Rooms

Hon Dr Brian Walker to move —

That this House —

- (a) notes the tabling in Victoria of John Ryan's independent review into the operation of the North Richmond Medically Supervised Injecting Room, and his report's conclusions that (a) up to 63 lives have been saved during the trial period, and (b) that the facility should now operate on a permanent basis;
- (b) notes and welcomes WA Labor's acceptance, as set out in its 2019 Policy Platform, that "drug and alcohol policy should be based on evidence of what works and what does not"; and
- (c) calls upon the McGowan Government to review the drug injecting room evidence from Victoria, and to report back to Parliament within the next twelve months on the potential to roll out a similar program here in Western Australia.

### 2. Perth Mint

Hon Dr Brian Walker to move —

(1) That this House notes that —

- (a) an ABC Four Corners program recently aired an investigation showing that The Perth Mint and its associated entities failed to comply with its legal obligations in various jurisdictions in Australia and around the world over a number of decades;
- (b) the Perth Mint has been practising "gold doping" which has severely damaged its reputation overseas; and
- (c) Premier Mark McGowan and other Ministers in his Government have been aware of compliance and other problems regarding The Perth Mint for some time but have not taken appropriate action, as the WA taxpayers would have expected.

- (2) Calls on the McGowan Government to create a Royal Commission into the scandals at The Perth Mint.
- (3) Calls on the McGowan Government to amend the *Gold Corporation Act 1987* to ensure that whistle blowers are not punished or prevented from speaking about illegal activity at The Perth Mint.
