### 11. **METRONET** (*Notice given 15 May 2024*)

Hon Tjorn Sibma: To move —

That this House —

- (a) recognise that at a staggering capital cost of \$13 billion, the enormous 400 per cent blow out in METRONET, has impeded, and continues to thwart the planning and delivery of other important infrastructure projects across the entirety of Western Australia;
- (b) note that METRONET's expected recurrent costs, including future Public Transport Authority operating subsidies, will constrain expenditure on the delivery of other key government services across and beyond the future estimates period, and weaken Western Australia's future capacity to respond to deepening problems and changing circumstances; and
- (c) acknowledge that the Minister for Transport's seven years of grossly mismanaging the METRONET project are indicative of the Cook Labor Government's incompetence and fixation on wrong priorities.
