  - (a) do or omit to do any act for the purpose of enabling or aiding the person bound by the order to breach the order; or
  - (b) aid the person bound by the order to breach the order; or
  - (c) counsel or procure the person bound by the order to breach the order.

### 16A. Review of Act

- (1) The Minister is to carry out a review of the operation and effectiveness of sections 12, 25, 30D, 30F, 32, 61A and 61B of the *Restraining Orders Act* 1997 as soon as is practicable after the expiration of 24 months from the commencement of the *Restraining Orders Amendment Act 2011* and in the course of that review the Minister is to consider and have regard to
  - (a) the effectiveness of those sections;
  - (b) the need for the retention of those sections; and
  - (c) any other matters that appear to the Minister to be relevant to the operation and effectiveness of those sections.
- (2) Without limiting subsection (1), in carrying out a review under that subsection, the Minister is to consult with and have regard to the views of the Commissioner of Police, the Commissioner for Children and Young People and of organisations representing the views of Aboriginal peoples.

(3) The Minister is to prepare a report based on the review and, as soon as is practicable after the report is prepared, is to cause it to be laid before each House of Parliament.
