1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 3.30pm pursuant to order.

Hon Simon O'Brien presented a petition, by delivery to the Clerk, [SO 130], from 19 residents of Western Australia requesting that the Legislative Council investigate the approval by Rockingham City Council of the Ramada-Marriott Hotel development. (Table paper 1373).

Hon Dee Margetts presented a petition from 439 residents of Western Australia requesting that the Legislative Council investigate placing a moratorium on the introduction of genetically engineered products. (Table paper 1374).

Recalls the Labor Party's pre-election claims that it "understood the public health system" and "would fix the health system" and calls upon the Government to explain -

- (a) why the State's health system is under more pressure now than it was in February 2001, especially in relation to staffing;
- (b) why it has cut back rural health services;
- (c) why the Minister for Health will not support an MRI scanner for the Southern Metropolitan Area;
- (d) the failure to obtain a PET scanner;
- (e) why it has halved funding for the Central Waitlist Bureau;
- (f) why it has sacked country hospital boards;
- (g) the inadequacy of emergency services to outer suburban areas; and
- (h) the inadequacy of funding for health services generally.
