4. Criminal Appeals Amendment Bill 2021

The Attorney General, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for “An Act to amend the Criminal Appeals Act 2004 to introduce rights of further appeal against conviction, and to make consequential amendments to –

- the *Bail Act 1982*; and
- the *Criminal Procedure Act 2004*; and
- the *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994*; and

- the *Supreme Court Act 1935*.” be introduced and read a first time

The Attorney General presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Attorney General moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr P.J. Rundle moved, That the debate be adjourned.

5. Children and Community Services Amendment Bill 2021

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council for concurrence.

6. Agricultural Produce Commission Amendment Bill 2021

That a bill for “An Act to amend the Agricultural Produce Commission Act 1988.” be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Minister for Tourism presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Minister for Tourism moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr P.J. Rundle moved, That the debate be adjourned.

7. Family Court Amendment Bill 2021
