- place greater workplace control in the hands of unions; and
- ignore the clear preference of the vast majority of employers and employees to operate
- in a non-union environment,

which are undermining business and investment confidence in Western Australia and, accordingly, advises His Excellency that the Government should re-institute an approach to industrial relations that will regain confidence in the State's economic future.".
