 - (iv) this determination will have regard to evidence applicable to Western Australia in respect of service quality, service sustainability, risk management, cost benefit analysis, and consumer satisfaction.
- (2) The Committee, and the proceedings of the Committee, are subject to Chapter XXII of Standing Orders and it is to be regarded for all purposes as a committee appointed under that Chapter.
- (3) The Committee may present interim reports without a requirement for leave and is to report finally not later than 30 March 2007.
