



LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TUESDAY, 10 AUGUST 2021 2.00pm

1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 2.00pm pursuant to order. The President, Hon Alanna Clohesy, took the Chair. Prayers and an Acknowledgement of Country were read.

2. President's Ruling — Documents Sought to be Tabled by the Leader of the Opposition

The President ruled as follows —

On Wednesday, 4 August 2021 the Leader of the Opposition sought my advice in relation to his intention to seek leave to table certain documents. These documents were correspondence passing between the Leader of the Opposition and the Chair of the Procedure and Privileges Committee relating to the current inquiry on the Review of the Standing Orders.

The Leader of the Opposition acknowledged in his speech that submissions to a parliamentary committee are confidential to the committee until such time as the committee agrees to release it. However, he appears to be under a misapprehension that documentation not published by the Procedure and Privileges Committee may be tabled and published in the Council Chamber because absolute privilege applies to that publication. I note that at this time the Procedure and Privileges Committee has not published any submission or other correspondence received by it related to its inquiry.

The Standing Orders permit committees, and ultimately the House, to control the publication of committee records. The Standing Orders provide that private evidence, which include submissions or any document or record received by a Committee, or Committee material including correspondence sent by a Committee shall not be published by any Committee member or person, unless otherwise ordered by the Committee or the Council. In these circumstances it would be contrary to the Standing Orders for the correspondence to be tabled.

Hon Nick Goiran presented a petition from 2,172 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council to inquire into the *Public Health Amendment (Safe Access Zones) Bill 2021.* (Tabled Paper 440).
