NON-GOVERNMENT BUSINESS

1. Transparency and Accountability

Hon Colin de Grussa: To move —

That the Legislative Council expresses its concern at the Labor Government's continued lack of transparency and accountability in relation to decision making, board appointments and the financial management of its agencies.

PRIVATE MEMBERS' BUSINESS

1. Investment in Mental Health

Hon Peter Foster: To move —

That the Legislative Council —

- (a) acknowledges that the issue of mental health is everyone's business; that all employers, workers, communities and governments must take responsibility for shaping a society in which good mental health is prioritised;
- (b) notes that many extrinsic factors, including work, workplace culture, home environment, social, sexual, ethnic minority or economic status, make some people more likely to experience poorer mental health outcomes;
- (c) notes that the McGowan Government has invested an additional \$495 million in the 2021-2022 budget, to new and ongoing mental health services; and
- (d) acknowledges that those recent investments in mental health will benefit many people with mental health issues, and continue to provide high quality mental health care outcomes for anyone who needs it.
