THURSDAY, 22 MARCH 2007

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

2. Speaker's Statement - Unparliamentary Language

The Speaker advised members that it was unparliamentary to use a name other than the name of a member's electorate, especially when it was designed to ridicule a member or use some form of humour against a member. The Speaker also advised members that it was unparliamentary to use the word 'corruption' to describe the actions of a government, an opposition or a party, and that if there was a need to pursue an allegation of that nature, it should be done through a substantive motion.

3. Petitions

Daylight Saving - Mr G. Snook presented a petition from 1,986 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly amends the *Daylight Saving Act 2006* to provide a referendum within one month of this year's finishing date of 25 March 2007 (P. 194).

Royal Perth Hospital - Dr K.D. Hames presented a petition from 4,500 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly strongly opposes the closure of Royal Perth Hospital and ensures the retention of the name 'Royal Perth Hospital' (P. 195).
