Point of Order

Hon Simon O'Brien raised the following Point of Order -

I think the prerogative to call for a division rests with the Member whose view has not prevailed, but if the ayes have it, the Honourable Member should be well satisfied with that and not call for a division.

Deputy Chair's Ruling

Members, the point of order from Hon Simon O'Brien went to the calling of a division. I draw Members' attention to Standing Order 78, which states —

- (1) After the President has declared an opinion on the resolution of a question (Standing Order 77), a Member may challenge that opinion by calling for a division immediately.
- (2) A Member who calls for a division shall not leave the Council, and shall vote with those Members who, in the opinion of the President, were in the minority.
- (3) If the President determines that an absolute majority is required, the President shall advise the Council accordingly and conduct a division.

The Member calling a division would be obliged to vote with the minority. The Chair called the question with the ayes. I said that the ayes have it, and then a division was called, and I gave the instruction to ring the bells, at which time the point of order was made.

I draw Members' attention to Standing Order 80, "Division May Be Cancelled", which states ----

At any time before the Tellers are appointed, a call for a division may be withdrawn by leave of the Council, and the division shall not be proceeded with. The decision of the President which was challenged shall then stand.
