### 1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 am pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

An Acknowledgement of Country and Prayers were read.

### 2. Brief Ministerial Statements

The Minister for Culture and the Arts on the Australian Museums and Galleries Association (AMaGA) 2022 National Conference held in Perth from 14-17 June 2022.

The Minister for Culture and the Arts on the Martumili Artists digital artwork, Yarrkalpa – Hunting Ground, displayed at Vivid Sydney.

The Minister for Culture and the Arts on the adoption of a Memorandum of Understanding relating to Corruption and Crime Commission prosecutions.

The Minister for Planning on the death of Jim Lovretta, a former Swan Valley Planning Committee member.

The Minister for Aboriginal Affairs on Reconciliation Week 2022.
