- (6) A person who operates a sexual service business must not supply services to a person unless that person provides evidence to the person operating the business that the person is over 18 years of age by one of the following means that bears a photograph of the person and indicates by reference to the person's date of birth or otherwise that the person has reached 18 years of age
  - (a) a current passport;
  - (b) a current Australian driver's license;
  - (c) a prescribed document.

# Penalty:

- (a) for a first offence, a fine of \$24 000;
- (b) for a second or subsequent offence, imprisonment for 3 years.
- (7) A person who receives evidence under subsection (6) must
  - (a) make a copy of the evidence; and
  - (b) make a record of when the evidence was provided and to whom the evidence was provided; and
  - (c) keep the copy of the evidence and the record for a period of 3 years from the day on which the evidence was copied or the record made.

### Penalty:

- (a) for a first offence, a fine of \$24 000;
- (b) for a second or subsequent offence, imprisonment for 3 years.
