1873. Mr M. McGowan to the Minister for Housing and Works

I refer to the Council of Australian Government's National Strategy on Energy Efficiency, and ask:

- (a) has the State Government completed an independent audit into the energy efficiency of its public housing stocks, as detailed in Measure 3.3.4 of the *National Strategy on Energy Efficiency*;
- (b) if no to (a), when will this audit be commenced, completed and made public;
- (c) if yes to (a), will the results be made public and when; and

(d) if yes to (a), what energy efficiency upgrades has the Government committed to making to Western Australia's public housing?

- (g) does the Government intend to retain the government-owned Spencer Street Property?

- (b) can the Minister advise if there are any legislative or regulatory restrictions on the sale of GM Canola seed at this point in time?

- (1) Is it true competitors at Perth Motorplex are required to obtain insurance from a company associated with Speedway West; and
 - (a) if so, why?
- (2) Has the Minister received complaints about the requirement; and
 - (a) if so, how many?
- (3) What action has the Minister taken in response to these complaints?

1880. Mr E.S. Ripper to the Minister for Education

- (1) Is the Minister aware the City of Belmont and Belmont College partner a specialised Youth and Family Service addressing the needs of Belmont's Cultural and Linguistically Diverse community?
- (2) Is the Minister aware the City of Belmont and Belmont City College have identified a critical need to improve services supporting Belmont's Cultural and Linguistically Diverse community?
- (3) Will the Minister provide more support services for students with language and cultural issues in the Belmont area; and
 - (a) if not, why not?

- (4) Will the Minister advise how the current services compare with services provided in other districts with significant culturally and linguistically diverse communities; and
 - (a) If not, why not?
- (5) Will the Minister provide additional resources to the school; and
 - (a) if not, why not?

1881. Mr T.G. Stephens to the Minister for Lands

In reference to the Land Corps new Neman LIA subdivision that includes lot 18 Wonmunna Road, Light Industrial Area (LIA), Newman:

- (a) when did LandCorp become aware of the standard that the Water Corporation applies to the capacity of the water supply network necessary for lots within this land development;
- (b) is it normal practice for LandCorp to release land for sale that does not comply with the Water Corporation's standards in reference to the capacity of the water supply network; and
- (c) will the Minister ensure that LandCorp accepts responsibility for installing a water supply network to the lots in this development that meets the regulatory requirements of the Water Corporation; and
 - (i) if not, why not?

1882. Mr T.G. Stephens to the Minister for Emergency Services

In reference to the Water Corporation's design standards for LandCorp's new Neman LIA subdivision that includes lot 18 Wonmunna Road, Light Industrial Area (LIA), Newman:

- (a) what is the water supply standard that has been applied for lots released in this development;
- (b) when did this particular standard come into effect;
- (c) will the Minister table the regulation and any other details that explains the water supply standard that has been applied to this land development; and
- (d) specifically, was this standard in place prior to the LandCorp putting these lots onto the market?

1883. Mr T.G. Stephens to the Minister for Water

- (1) What water supply standard is applicable, in terms of water capacity in the water utility main, for land that is zoned or used for schools and pre-schools and day care facilities across Western Australia?
- What water supply is available to the new Newman day care facility provided to the local community by BHP Billiton and operated by the YMCA?
- (3) Does this water supply capacity meet the basic safety standard for a large day care facility of this sort?

1884. Mr T.G. Stephens to the Minister for Lands

What steps will the Minister take to ensure that land is available to meet the needs of the business community of Tom Price for 'light industry' blocks?

- (1) Is the Minister aware of the urgent need of the Warralong Community 175kms east of Port Hedland for a transport link to secure access to their regional centre in Port Hedland so that they can access essential health and medical services, as well as for the purchasing of essential food supplies for the families living in this community?
- (2) Is there any capacity within any of the programs of the Minister's portfolio departments or agencies to assist this large community, with a regular bus service to their major regional centre in Port Hedland?
- (3) What steps can the Department of Lands take to ensure that urgent and favourable consideration is given to responding to the pressing transport needs of this community for a regular bus service?
