3. Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes - National Crime Authority (State Provisions) Amendment Bill 2002 - Extension of Reporting Time

Hon Simon O'Brien presented a Report of the Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes in relation to the *National Crime Authority (State Provisions) Amendment Bill 2002* seeking an extension of time from November 14 2002 to November 28 2002. (Tabled paper 471).

Hon Simon O'Brien moved, That the Report do lie upon the Table and be adopted and agreed to. Question - put and passed.

4. Australian Involvement in Military Action in Iraq

Motion No. 6 having been called.

Debate resumed on the motion of Hon Dee Margetts as follows -

That this House notes -

- (1) The recent comments from the Prime Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs regarding Australia's possible support for US military action in Iraq.
- (2) That these comments were made in the absence of any United Nations resolution or processes.
- (3) The threat to the livelihood of Western Australian agricultural producers and exporters in light of the Prime Minister's indication that any request for Australian assistance would be considered against the "national interest test".
- (4) The statements from Labour Leader Simon Crean that Mr Howard's and Mr Downer's statements are out of step with other international opinion.
- (5) The likely impact on the civilian population, particularly women and children.

Therefore, the Legislative Council informs the Federal Government that is does not support Australian involvement in military action in Iraq without UN backing.

Debate ensued.

Point of Order

Hon Norman Moore raised the following Point of Order -

Will the President indicate when this debate will conclude as the decision last week was made for only last week. While I am on my feet, I suggest that a solution to this is that we deal with Committee Report No. 6 from the Procedure and Privileges Committee first, because that deals with this issue, and then we could move on to the other Report. That would sort out a couple of problems at the same time. I seek the President's ruling on what time this debate will conclude.

President's Ruling

The President ruled as follows -

The Leader of the Opposition is correct that under our current Standing Orders without alteration either permanently, as is proposed in the Sixth Report, or as a temporary expedient, we will continue this debate until one o'clock. We are now in Committee of the Whole. Any move to change the order would require us, by motion, to go out of Committee in order to effect that change. I call the first item at this stage. As Members can talk for 10 minutes at a time, it might be appropriate that the Leader of the Opposition speak to the Leader of the House during that time and we can see whether we can report progress at some time.

Debate resumed on the motion of Hon George Cash, That the Report be adopted and agreed to.

6. Wildlife Conservation (Fauna Protection) Amendment Bill 2002

Hon Christine Sharp pursuant to notice, moved -

That a Bill for "An Act to provide for the conservation and protection of fauna in cases where habitats are likely to suffer damage, or fauna will be subjected to interference or damage by intrusive activity, by amending the *Wildlife Conservation Act 1950* and including production contracts formed under the *Forest Products Act 2000*" be introduced and read a first time.

Question - put and passed.

Bill read a first time.

Hon Christine Sharp moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Hon Christine Sharp, by leave, tabled a stuffed Western Quoll for the remainder of today's sitting. (Tabled paper 473).
