SPEECH NOTES

OFFICIAL OPENING OF THE SHIRE OF KATANNING'S ADMINISTRATION AND CIVIC BUILDING

Introduction

- The State Government is delivering its plan for jobs and growth in the Great Southern region, with funding in the State Budget to create local jobs and support the local economy, while delivering vital community infrastructure and services.
- Important investments in the region include \$35 million in the Albany Ring Road, \$2.6 million for the Great Southern Housing Initiative and \$2.5 million for infrastructure upgrades at William Bay National Park.
- Katanning is strategically located as a key service hub for the central Great Southern region.
- With a town population of approximately 4,000 people, and a total Local Government population of just under 5,000, Katanning represents about 7% of the total population of the Great Southern, and engages with a wider regional population of 12,500 people.
- The State Government investment of \$1.8 million in Royalties for Regions has seen the development of a new Administration and Civic Centre established within the Heritage Precinct as part of its continued revitalisation.
- This new facility will help activate and transform the precinct to a high quality space that will drive economic growth and transform the town into a sustainable regional centre.
- This new Administration and Civic Centre complements other State Government investment in the revitalisation of Katanning, including the Katanning Heritage Centre project, representing \$12.7 million investment, comprising the Welcome Precinct and Piesse Lake Development.

Main points

Katanning Administration and Civic Centre

- Katanning boasts a built heritage that is, in many respects, unrivalled by any other town
 of its size in regional WA.
- It is one of the more historical towns in the State and arguable one of the most important rural towns, due to its social and economic history.
- Notably, Katanning had the first inland swimming pool and was the first town to have electric street lights.

- Significant heritage buildings include the Flour Mill, Mechanics Institute, and Kobeelya House (the Piesse family residence), and there are many other buildings designed by prominent Western Australian architects.
- The new Administration and Civic Centre building was achieved by redeveloping part of the Katanning Hotel.
- This building, housing this modern new Shire of Katanning administration office, accommodates 40 Shire staff, new council chambers, amenities and community gardens within the external courtyard area.
- The new council chambers will provide a space for council to represent the interests and views of local people that inspire community development projects.
- In line with the McGowan Government's Local Content initiative, more than 25 per cent
 of the Administration and Civic Centre building budget went back into the regional
 economy through trades, services and materials:
 - Fit out and furniture were supplied by a local store
 - o custom cabinetry and furniture were made by a local carpenter, and
 - o landscaping was undertaken by a local firm.
- Throughout the build, it is estimated around 30 local people were employed.
- An additional 300 square metres of the Katanning Hotel has been redeveloped as a 'business incubator' and archive space, with approximately \$300,000 investment from the Katanning Town Centre Commercial and Streetscape Revitalisation Project.
- The business incubator provides a hub for small to medium enterprises to become
 established through the sharing of facilities, such as meeting rooms, reception space
 and office equipment.
- This facility is expected to drive business growth and innovation efforts in Katanning.
- The combined Administration and Civic Centre is ideally set to service Katanning's growing regional centre and diverse mix of government, community, retail and business services.

Other State Government projects in Katanning

- Planning has identified significant potential to diversify and strengthen the economy to create employment growth and expansion of the tourism sector and associated services.
- The upgrade of the welcome precinct, town centre and associated projects are currently being implemented. These projects are attracting new investment and instilling increased community confidence in this Katanning's future.
- The three largest industry sectors are underpinned by agriculture, including (by output):
 - o wholesale trade, worth \$138 million
 - agriculture, valued at \$88 million, and
 - o manufacturing, worth \$63 million.
- The largest single employer in Katanning is the WAMMCO abattoir, which employs
 more than 300 locals and produces and exports premium quality chilled frozen lamb
 meat, generating significant income for the town and residents.

Katanning a major service centre for agriculture

- Reflecting its status as a major agriculture service centre, the State Government has invested in crop and sheep research at the Department of Primary Industry and Regional Development's Katanning Research Facility.
- Sheep research and development is about to leap forward with a \$1.3 million investment in a new sheep feed efficiency facility at the facility.
- This nationally significant facility will enable department researchers to electronically record the feed intake of individual sheep, fed a range of different diets under commercial conditions, to identify genetically superior animals to target in breeding programs.
- The department has significant collaborative research projects based in Katanning that support technical developments needed for new value chains in the future.
- Other agricultural service facilities include the Katanning Sheep Saleyards, the largest undercover sheep selling complex in the southern hemisphere.

- This \$25.4 million world class facility was funded by the State and Commonwealth Governments, and the Shire of Katanning following business case development supported by the Great Southern Development Commission.
- The saleyard comprises 1,276 pens (1,012 selling pens), under a 4.4 hectare roof, surrounded by 5ha of bitumen.
- The facility can manage up to 45,000 sheep per sale, or 1.2 million sheep per year, and incorporates high standards in handling, occupational safety, animal welfare and sustainability. The facility also features water capture and solar power generation.
- Katanning enjoys genuine growth prospects based on a diversity of agricultural, mining, education and value adding and tourism valued at worth more than \$18 million.
- Katanning is also lauded for its highly diverse population, which is unique to regional WA,
 with around a quarter of residents born overseas and a migrant base of over 50 nationalities.
- Combined with Katanning's high concentration of Indigenous Australians, with about 400 residents identifying as Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander or both, the town boasts a population rich in cultural diversity.

Conclusion

- In conclusion, I reiterate this new administration building demonstrates confidence in the future of Katanning's community and creates a vibrant hub for future business and community development.
- The sustainability of our regional communities is vital and State Government investment has continued to strengthen and develop the Shire of Katanning as an attractive place to live, visit and work.
- It is now my pleasure to announce the new Katanning Administration and Civic Centre open.

Background (if relevant)

- The 2019-20 State Budget includes \$4.2 billion of Royalties for Regions funding dedicated to regional Western Australia.
- Katanning comprises a number of facilities commensurate with being a district centre and provides higher order services to a number of smaller neighbouring towns including Kojonup, Woodanilling, Nyabing, Tambellup, Wagin, Broomehill, Gnowangerup and Dumbleyung.

- Katanning Sheep Feed Facility tenders awarded and construction underway
- Colab Construction Pty Ltd successful tenderer, based in Albany

Sheep feed conversion research

- Feed conversion sheep that genetically require less feed and produce less methane and carbon dioxide emissions

- Currently no genetic selection for feed efficiency traits in sheep, due to difficulty in measuring individual feed intake
- Significant potential for genetic gains in feed conversion efficiency, especially during the WA summer-autumn feed gap when supplementary feeding is common
- National R&D Framework DPIRD has the lead role for wool
- DPIRD has been an international leader in feed intake research, particularly for pigs and sheep, at its former Medina Research Facility
- Complementary to existing assets at Katanning
- DPIRD hosts the Genetics Resource Flock at Katanning, for which eating quality, growth and other traits are already measured
- DPIRD has a DEXA machine at Katanning to measure body composition to improve meat quality traits
- Nationally significant resource

DPIRD sheep research

- When completed DPIRD will be using the Katanning Sheep Facility to undertake experiments that will contribute to the transformation of the WA sheep industry
 - The facility will enable the sheep industry to measure sires in the Genetic Resource Flock for feed efficiency and body composition
- DPIRD is currently working on a range of projects providing direct benefit to the WA sheep industry. Research areas, including:
 - identification of hard to measure sheep traits,
 - o breeding for resistance against disease,
 - developing options for out of season feeding for sheep and improvement in pasture production
 - development of new sheep meat products including dry aged sheep-meat
- DPIRD's Katanning Research Facility synonymous with sheep research
 - Hosts one of two national Genetic Resource Flocks (previous known as Information Nucleus Flock, the other flock is located in NSW)
 - Katanning hosts a number of other DPIRD sheep research projects, such as Yardstick, the WA sire evaluation scheme for wool production traits, and research projects from Murdoch University

Academic & industry sheep RD&I collaboration

- There has been strong interest and support in the new Katanning facility from:
 - o Universities UWA, Murdoch
 - Industry Sheep breeders, V&V Walsh, WAMMCO, feedlotters and producers
 - National funding bodies Meat & Livestock Australia, Australian Wool Innovation
- Facility will help to attract public and private sector RD&I funds to WA
- Facility when appropriate will be open for use by other research and industry bodies working with DPIRD
